CALIFORNIA COVID-19 TIERS

TIER 1) WIDESPREAD OR PURPLE

WHAT IT MEANS: Many nonessential indoor business operations are closed

CRITERIA:

of new daily cases: More than 7 per 100K people Positivity rate: More than 8%

TIER 2) SUBSTANTIAL OR RED

WHAT IT MEANS: Some nonessential indoor business operations are closed

CRITERIA:

of new daily cases: 4-7 per 100K people Positivity rate: Between 5% and 8%

TIER 3) MODERATE OR ORANGE

WHAT IT MEANS: Some indoor business operations are open with modifications

CRITERIA:

of new daily cases: 1-3.9 per 100K people Positivity rate: Between 2% and 4.9%

TIER 4) MINIMAL OR YELLOW

WHAT IT MEANS: Most indoor business operations are open with modifications

CRITERIA:

of new daily cases: Less than 1 per 100K people Positivity rate: Less than 2%





Now that LA County has moved from the "Purple Tier" into the "Red Tier," high schools are allowed to reopen. (Prior to this, we were not allowed to.)

SCHOOLS (K-12)	 Schools meeting requirements may open for in-person instruction for grades TK-6 Students must be assigned to stable groups of students 	 Local school officials will decide whether and when that will occur. Schools may reopen fully for in-person instruction Continue to require adherence to LA County Public Health school re-opening protocols

When we were in the "Purple Tier," DVC followed the lowest-risk guidelines for schools:

Continuum of risk

By learning model and implementation of proven mitigation strategies

In general, the risk of spread of COVID-19 in schools increases across the continuum of virtual, hybrid, to in-person learning. The risk for hybrid and in-person learning can be lowered depending on the mitigation strategies put in place and the extent to which they are followed.

While not exhaustive, this stratification attempts to characterize the risks of spread among students, teachers, and staff across this continuum:

Lowest risk:

• Students and teachers engage in virtual-only classes, activites, and events.

Now that we are in the "Red Tier", we will begin a plan that follows these guidelines:

Some risk:

- Hybrid Learning Model, where **most** students and teachers participate in virtual learning and **some** students and teachers engage in in-person learning, with:
 - Small, in-person classes, activities, and events
 - Cohorting and alternating or staggered schedules, rigorously applied
 - No mixing of groups of students and teachers throughout/across school days
 - No sharing of objects between students and teachers
 - Students, teachers, and staff following **all steps** to <u>protect themselves and others</u> **at all times** including proper use of face masks, social distancing, and hand hygiene
 - Regularly scheduled **and consistent** (i.e., at least daily or between uses) <u>cleaning</u> of frequently touched areas

Students and teachers engage **entirely in in-person** learning, activities, and events with:

- Some mixing of groups of students and teachers throughout/across school days

Come August, we expect to follow a plan according to these guidelines:

- Some sharing of objects between students and teachers
- Students, teachers, and staff following some steps to protect themselves and others such as proper use of face
 masks, social distancing, and hand hygiene
- Irregular cleaning of frequently touched areas



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Reopening Plan Constraints & Goals



Reopening Plan Constraints



- 1) Minimum 6' spacing requirements
 - Works out to 12 students per classroom max
 - Normal class size is 36
- 2) Student grouping restrictions
 - CDC & LACDPH recommend no mixing of student groups
- 3) Staffing & supervision
 - Choice was given to all stakeholders of whether to return
- 4) Sharing common spaces with DVS & DVD



On-Campus Safety Procedures

School Environment Modifications

- Doors/gates designated for entry and exit to buildings, classrooms, yards and restrooms to reduce face to face interactions
- Physical distancing floor/seating markings are visible
- Hallways have adequate space and are designated as one-way, posting directional reminders on the walls and/or floors if appropriate
- Plexiglass for protection at high frequency areas

- Desks/seating arranged so that students are separated by 6 feet
- Furniture designed for group activities that bring students closer 6 feet have been **reconfigured or removed** from the sroom
 - vidual employee workstations set up to allow for separation of at least 6 feet
- Acquisition of additional outdoor canopy coverings for outdoor



Reopening Plan Goals



- 1) We want to reopen our schools safely as soon as possible for as many students as possible
- 2) We want our students to have the opportunity to reconnect in person with their peers and teachers
- 3) We want high-quality teaching and learning to continue
- 4) We want families to have a choice as to whether their child returns to campus in April, and for what activities
- 5) We want to be equitable in offering on-campus activity opportunities to students, providing each student what they need





Current Proposal



An Overview of the Current Proposal



From April-June, instruction at DVC will continue in the distance learning format that it has been since the beginning of the school year.

All on-campus activities are designed to be **supplemental** academic and socioemotional supports for students.

Students' classes will continue to take place online.



Reopening for On-Campus Activities



High-Priority Student Support

Async days from 1 - 3pm

Selected students in each grade level will have academic interventions available on asynchronous days.

Supervised Work Stations


A Days or B Days from 9am - 3pm

Students who need a quiet learning space with reliable WiFi will be provided a space on campus to do their class Zoom sessions.

Senior Activities

Scheduled bi-weekly

Seniors will have opportunities to be on campus on a biweekly basis, including in-person micro-graduations on 6/8 and 6/9.



Async days from 9:30 - 11:30am Every Connections class will have an opportunity to meet together on campus.
