FSA-ID



- Username and password combination
- Use to log in to U.S.
 Department of Education (ED) online systems
- Your legal signature
- No one created or used by anyone
- Use your FSA-ID every year



FAFSA



- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Used by the federal government to determine a family's eligibility for grants, work-study, and loans to pay for college.
- States, individual colleges and universities, and private scholarship programs also use information from the FAFSA to make financial aid decisions.
- Funding is often granted on a first-come, first-serve basis





Continue to work on UC and CSU applications

November ☐ EARLY DECISION /EARLY ACTION applications must be submitted by the November 1st or November 15th deadlines (includes application, supplements, tests and supporting credentials) Retake ACT, SAT and subject tests (if necessary)- do the best that you can! Check for emails and mail from CSUs and setting up portals and accounts Wednesday 11/15- "Press Submit Event": submit all your college applications during this event Confirm with the testing boards (*collegeboard.org* or *act.org*) that all tests scores are sent to the colleges Follow up with colleges/check portals to verify that all applications and credentials have been received Continue to perform strong academic work! Colleges will be looking at semester and final year grades for admission CSU and UC application closing date (11/30)
